They walk an uphill battle, some even before they are even born. Badisa sells these Poppies which represent each of these children. Except for the Poppie stickers, our offices also sell the Poppies for R150.



A SAFE HOME FOR ROBERT*



If I was a poppet, my two sisters and I would stay with my parents and we would be safe and sound. My parents would not be addicted to drugs and we would not have to live in a children's home.'

Robert's parents are drug addicts. They lost their jobs, their home, friends, the support of their families and eventually also their children.

Robert and his two sisters were placed in a children's home since foster parents willing to look after all three of them could not be found and the social worker wanted to keep them together.

The difference that Badisa made in the lives of Robert and his two sisters, was to temporarily place them in a children's home so that they could experience the safety and support their parents could not provide to them.

The social worker undertook a long and difficult journey of rehabilitation and recovery with Robert's parents.

She never stopped believing in their potential to rehabilitate and once again accept full responsibility for their three children.

After 3 years, Robert and his sisters could be reunified with their parents.
